



THREE METHODS OF BECOMING A MEMBER OF VACP:

- a. At-Large Member – An Individual not in a local practice group or who may be in a local practice group that does not require its members to meet VaCP membership criteria established by VaCP.
- b. Member Group (MG) - Local or Regional Practice Groups consisting of a minimum of five (5) Collaborative Professionals, 100% of whom meet the membership criteria established by VaCP and membership in the MG is dependant upon ALL members maintaining all VaCP membership criteria.
- c. Provisional Member Group (PMG) - Limited to geographical areas with no existing local practice group or in areas where the closest local practice group is 60 minutes or 60 miles. Such PMG may have less than five but not less than two members for its first year and 100% of its members must meet the membership criteria established by VaCP and membership in the PMG is dependant upon ALL members maintaining all VaCP membership criteria. After the first year, the member minimum is five and the PMG becomes a MG; however, the PMG may reapply for a one-year extension of its provisional status. (i.e., a training is scheduled and several area professionals are registered to attend, or the group already has trained professionals within a 60 minute/mile radius and is developing the practice group membership). A PMG has all the rights, privileges and obligations of a MG.
